Barry Lundgren had a Walnut bowl that was turned from a blank at the graft line of the tree, great contrast.

Terry Cohen dug out a special piece that due to the inspiration demo by Stuart Batty, Terry's version of a long thin stem goblet.

Anita Gleason surprised us all with her showing of a square with many others to make a "Patchwork Quilt".

Bob Gleason, offered for our viewing his method of turning a 1 piece ladle cut from a VEE shaped bowl. Also had some pens with "Funky dots".

Ernie Miller a 2 piece segmented Walnut hollow form.

Dan Ross has prepared a frisbee for the upcoming Fall Picnic along with one of his first pieces of segmented rings of spalted Mango.

Dennis Ivans, NOTE: Our newest member, showed a segmented bowl turned from one 2x4 stud finished with Watco Danish oil for the rim. A 2nd piece was what HE called ugly graft line Walnut w/epoxy finish.

Jerry Graybill presented pens of several different woods.

Walt Ross, combined his Carving skills and new turning skills to combine a BIG WOODEN NICKEL, now to find a coin slot to accommodate. He also submitted his first pen.

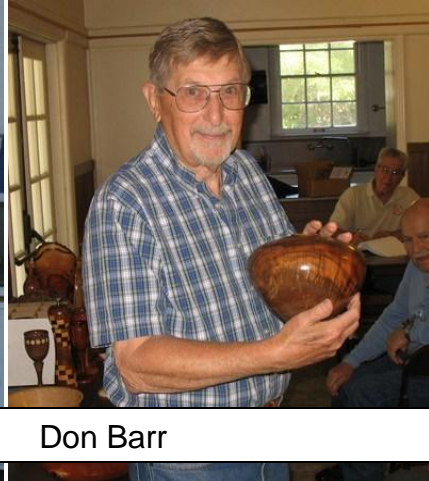

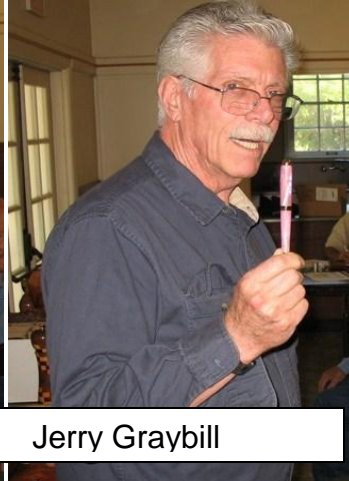




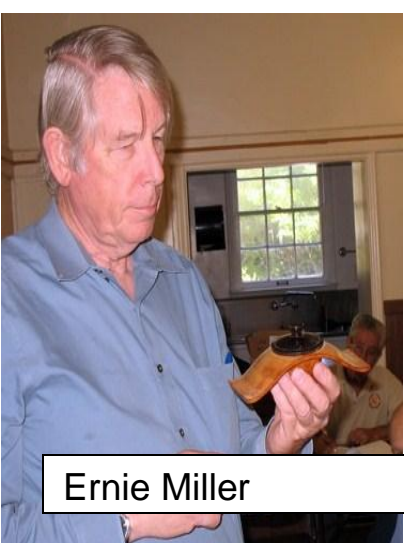
